

The Michigan Association of Mayors (MAM) is the official nonpartisan organization of Michigan's chief elected officials (mayors, village presidents, and urban township supervisors).

Representing over 100 Michigan communities, MAM works to assist chief elected officials (along with mayors pro tempore, village presidents pro tempore, and equivalent titles) of Michigan Municipal League full member municipalities; advance the various interests and operations of communities represented by its members and all Michigan communities; promote cooperation among communities statewide; and advocate local interests at both the state and federal levels.

The MAM Board of Directors is comprised of nine members. The MAM president serves as the spokesperson for the organization. The vice president and a diverse team of MAM members complete the Board of Directors.

Eligibility:

- Board members must be MAM members in good standing.

Term:

- Each Board member serves a three-year term.

Expectations & Responsibilities:

- Attend board meetings typically held at the following dates and locations:
 - January, held virtually
 - March, held virtually
 - June, held virtually or in a Board member community
 - August, held in conjunction with the MAM Summer Workshop, location varies
 - November, held at the MML Lansing office

Application Process:

- Nominations are made by a nominating committee and may also be taken from the floor at the Annual Meeting.

Selection Process:

- Three directors are elected each year by majority vote of the MAM membership at the Annual Meeting.
